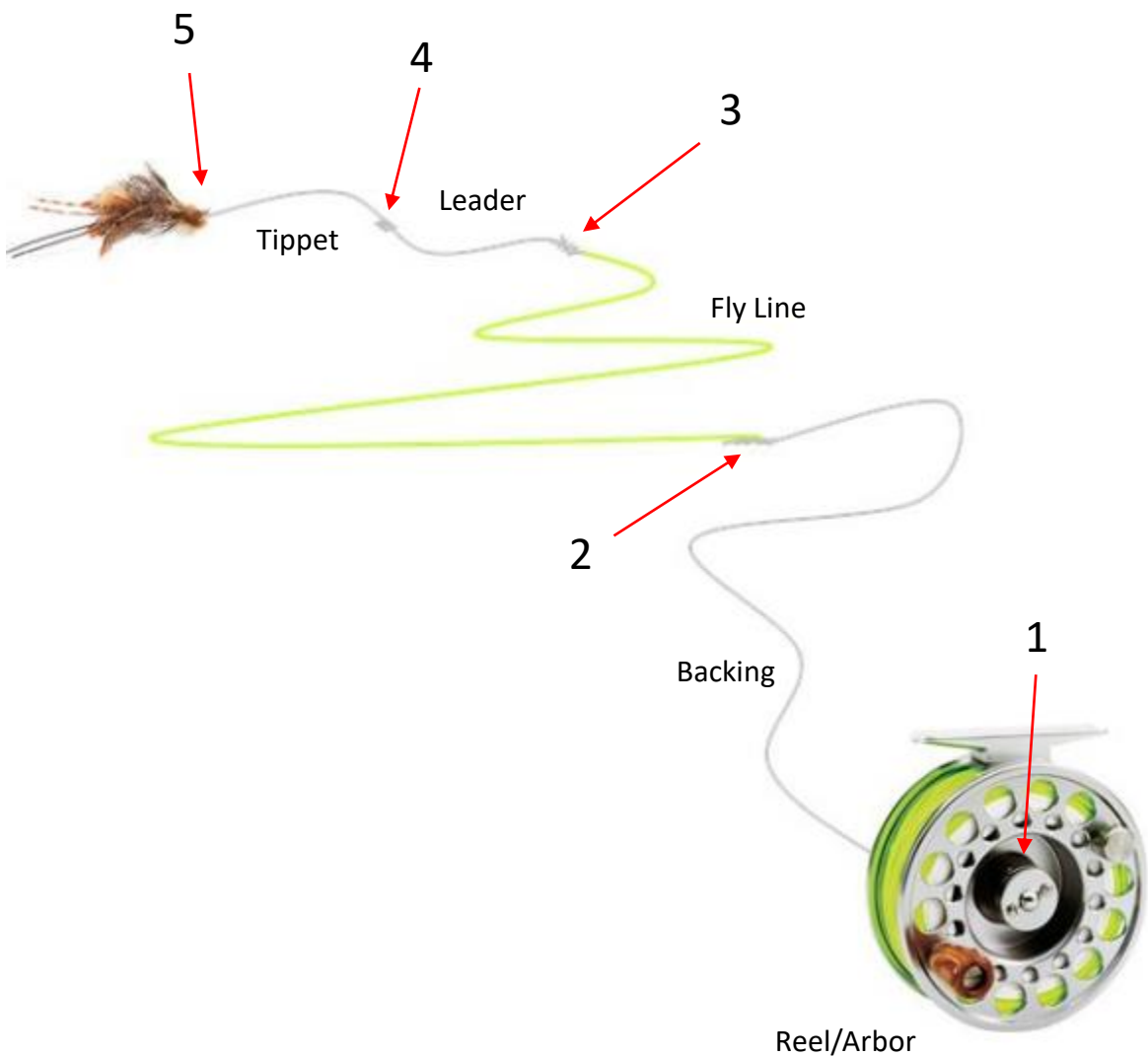


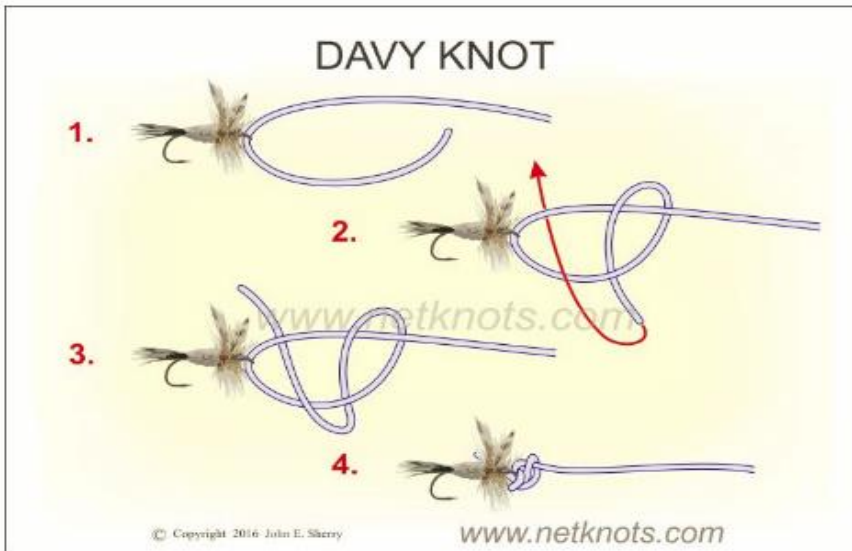

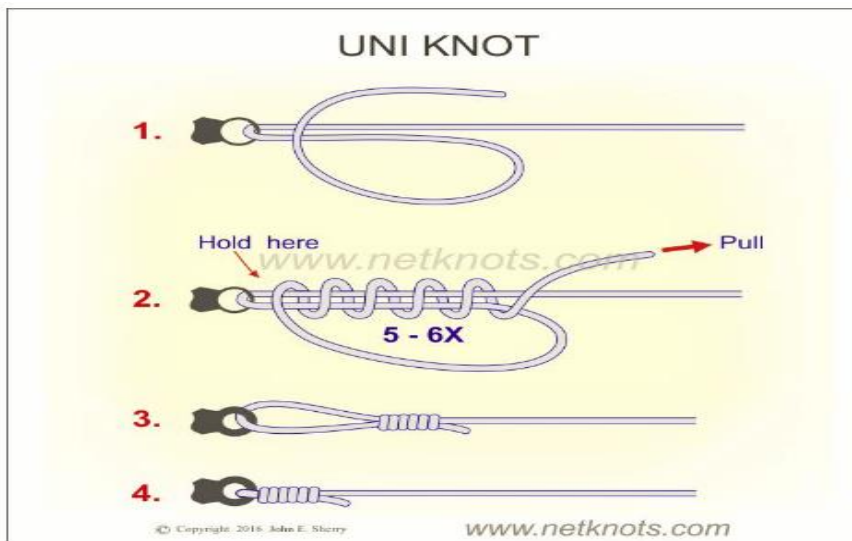

Quick and easy way to tie fly onto tippet



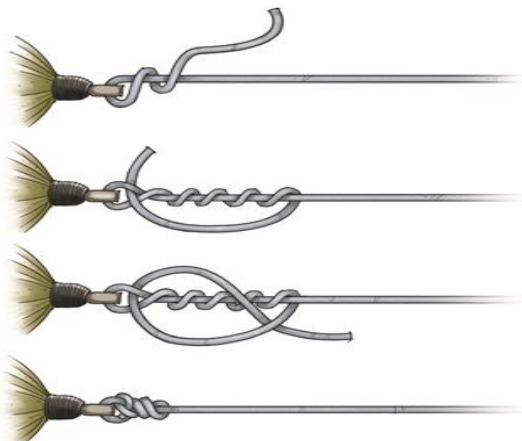
Uni Knot

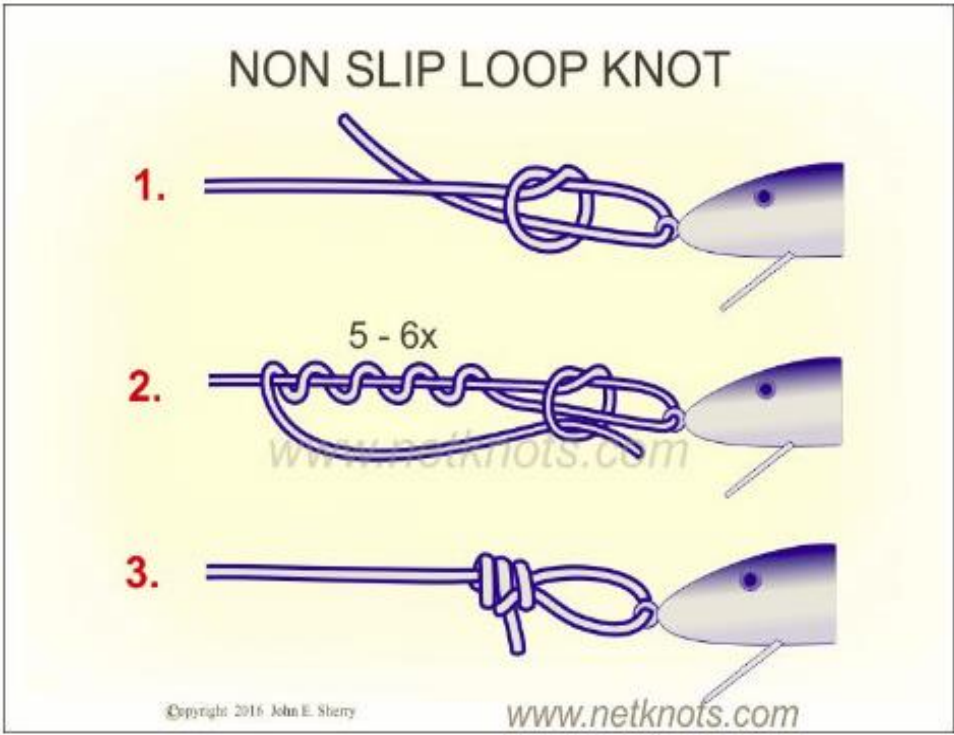
Easy method to tie a line to a hook.

Fly

Improved Clinch

- Excellent, strong knot - quicker to tie than other knots connecting tippet to fly
- Number of turns critical for knot strength, e.g. 5 to 7 turns for 8X to 10lb material

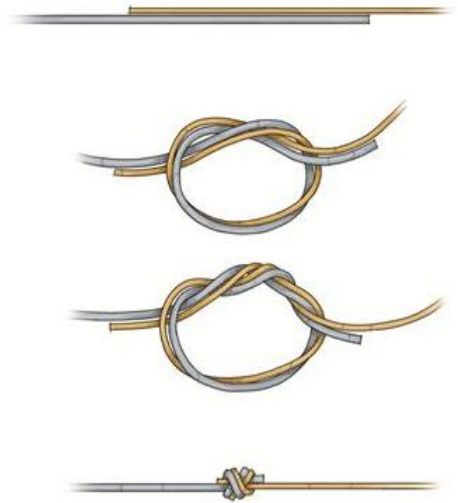




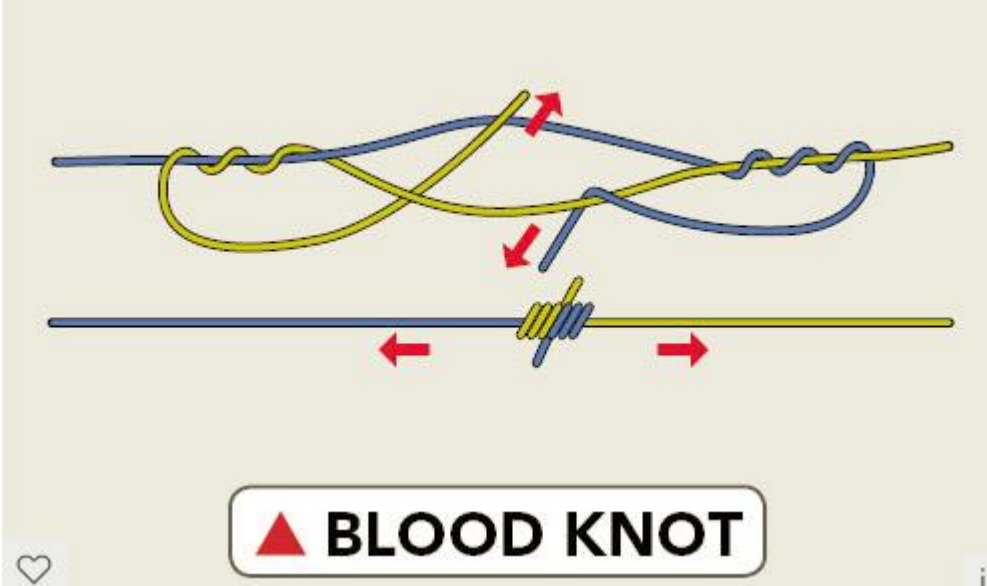
Tippet Material

Surgeons

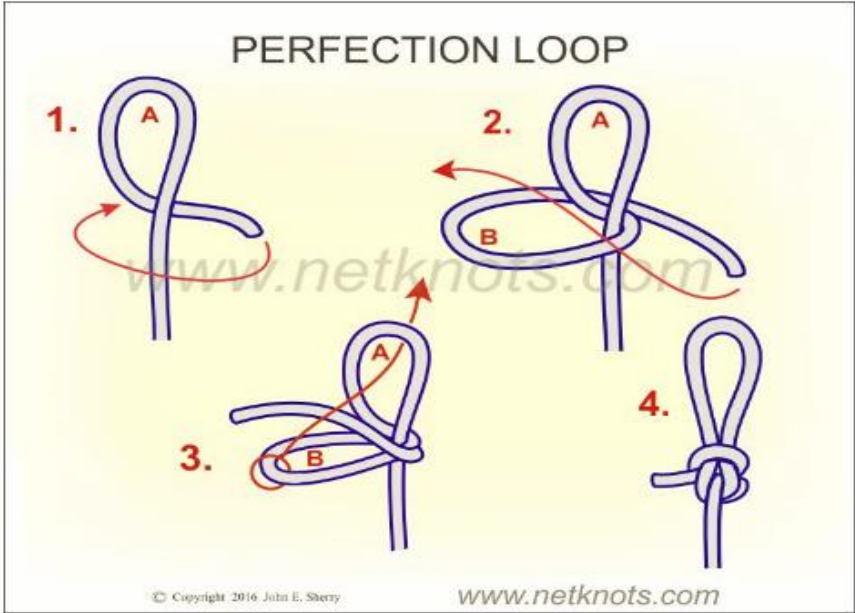
- Excellent - quick and easy - for joining lines of similar or dissimilar materials and diameters in line sizes ranging from 8X to 30 lbs
- Bulky in larger line sizes - not as clean and thin as a Blood Knot
- For material in size 8X to 2X use an extra turn through the loop in forming the knot (a three turn overhand knot instead of two)

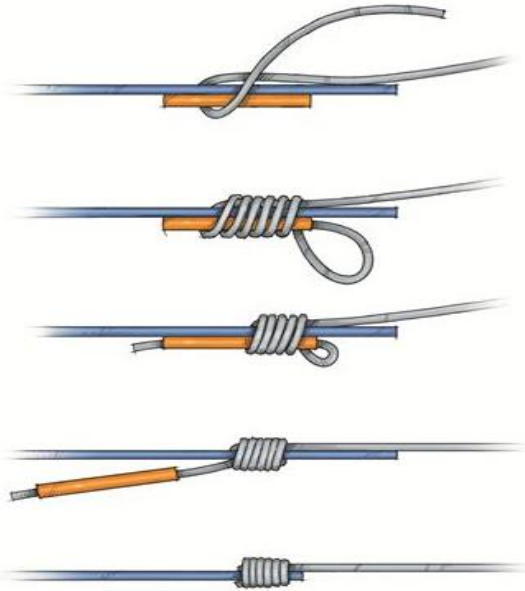
Perfection Loop

Leader

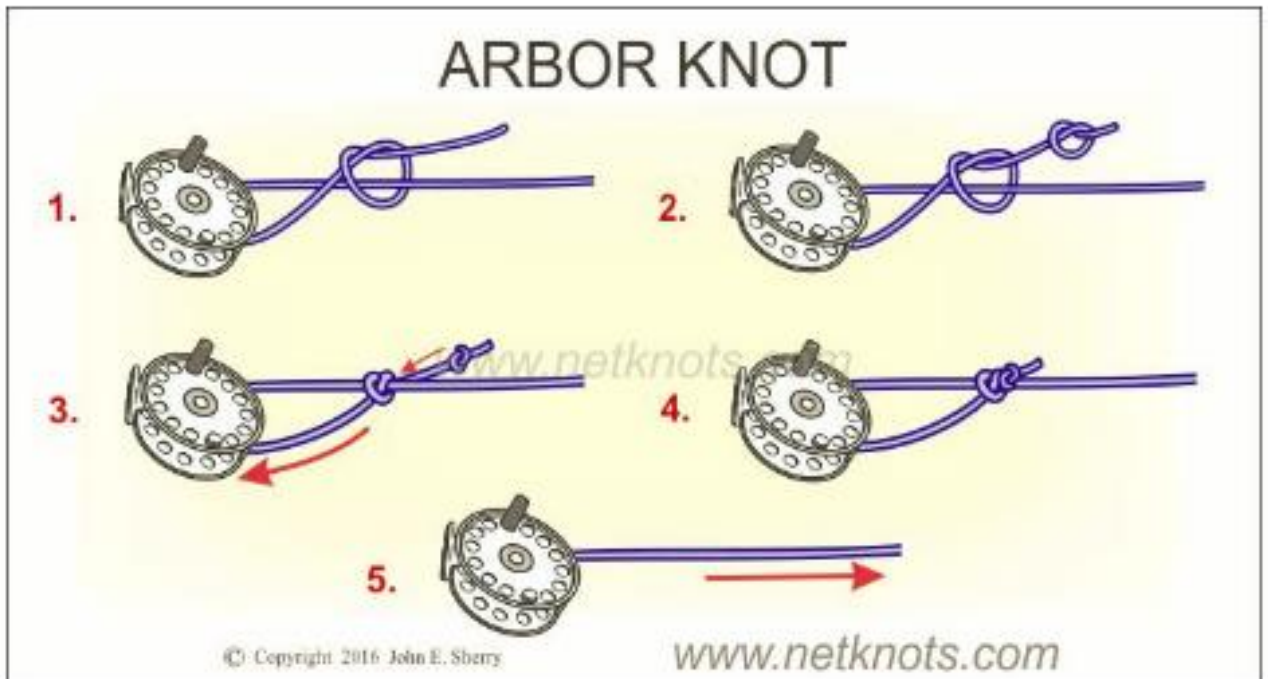
Nail Knot

























- Smooth, strong knot for all lines with braided cores
- For lines up through 6 weight only 5 turns are needed; for 7 weight and heavier lines 7 turns hold better
